A QUICK SUMMARY

We've had a good year, even while the addiction treatment field seems struggling to find its soul. We can confidently say that we have kept true to our 47-year mission—treating addiction with long-term, compassionate care. No one is turned away for lack of funds, and everyone is treated as a miracle waiting to happen.

In 2019, Dawn Farm provided the following:

We're proud of helping these folks, and of keeping all our programs and resources available throughout 2019. But then there came *the virus*.

Thankfully, we had already spent a number of weeks strategizing ways to meet the corona virus' impact. We developed specific plans, set up protocols and bought extra food and supplies—but nothing could have prepared us for the rapid changes, both locally and nationally.

Instead of meeting weekly, staff soon found themselves talking *hourly*. As the national situation unfolded, we began to circle the wagons, increasing our

protections each day. The situation was daunting.

We worked hard to keep the virus away, "sheltering in place" before it was widely done.

We also hoped for the help of the community to make this huge transition less painful to the people we serve.

The community around us—especially the recovering community—stepped up. Even beyond our high expectations!



Donations of food and cleaning products appeared. People wrote checks and offered to call and support our residents. Every day we received new calls and emails from people who cared, saying "What can I do?" and "How can I help?"

Local businesses offered support. A couple of local women created handmade (and stylish) protective masks for our entire staff! The love and commitment of the community has been overwhelming. We really needed help—and help appeared.

This has been a profoundly stressful time for all of us, but the Dawn Farm story has always been one of gratitude and awe—and these recent weeks were no different.

We have been dumbstruck by generosity. We have seen this amazing community rise up to help us yet again.

Detox, treatment, housing and an array of other services—Dawn Farm is all that.

But this week—this month—it's the surrounding community that is the star of Dawn Farm's culture.
