We have all been stunned in recent years by the many overdose deaths related to heroin and other opiate addictions. I go to too many funerals and accept too many memorial gifts after young people succumb to this disease.

But there is cause for real hope—there is a movement to not only rescue overdose victims but also help them get access to serious treatment.

It might be tempting to despair that these young men and women can't get better—but it simply isn't true. There's a group here that has started a website telling the stories of men and women who were addicted to heroin or other opiates *and* who now all have *at least five years clean and sober*. They call it **The Unicorn Project.**

We're inspired because the number of stories on this website keeps growing, because recovery is real, and hope is real, and because every day we see men and women who get—and stay—sober.


